Should We Tell People to "Accept" or to "Receive" Jesus in our Gospel Presentation?

(Please note: Pages 4 through 20 are appendices which contain long lists of Bible verses. You may not wish to print these pages)

Many believers wish to make their "Gospel" presentation not only understandable, but also accurate and true. When they search God's word for instruction, many have also come to the conclusion that a number of "pat" phrases which are commonly heard, are *not* found in the Bible and that some even conflict with the Good News found in John 3:16 and many other verses.

Some examples of these are:

Give your heart/life to Jesus
Ask Jesus into your heart
Turn from your sins, repent of your sins
Make Jesus Lord of your life
Confess Christ publicly
Walk down the aisle. Pray this prayer

These and many other phrases are either confusing, not found in the Bible, or even contradict the simple grace message of Eph. 2:8 and 9, by adding some form of man's effort to the finished work of Christ:

Eph 2:8 - For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9. Not of works, lest any man should boast.

There are also many verses which exhort believers to obedience and further discipleship. Sometimes these same verses are misapplied to the unbeliever for salvation and not to the believer for growth. The context is critical.

The goal of this paper is to approach two terms which are frequently used by many, including "grace" teachers, and to encourage those who use them to reevaluate their use. It is not our purpose to be "nitpicky" over words but to make the plan of salvation clear and understandable to those who have been blinded by Satan (II Cor. 4:4).

"Accept" Jesus as Your Savior

The word "accept" and its cognates are found 27 times in the KJV New Testament. (Appendix A). An evaluation of all of these verses drives us to the conclusion that, nowhere in the New Testament are we told to "accept" Christ. Several of these verses speak of believers or our works as being accepted by or acceptable to God. None speak of us accepting Jesus. None are referring to us becoming eternally saved. None are imperatives (commands).

Granted, that there have been those who were saved when they were told to accept Jesus, but they were saved when they actually *believed* in Him. Do we have to "accept" Jesus in order to be eternally saved? The Bible does not say that we need to. Would it not be better to stay as close to the Word as we can and just tell people to believe in Him?

"Receive" Jesus as Your Savior

The word "receive" and its cognates are found in 263 verses in the KJV New Testament. (Appendix B). I could only find 13 verses that referred in any way to receiving Christ. There are additional verses found which refer to "receiving the Holy Spirit, God's word, other believers, rewards for faithfulness, etc. and other occurrences which seem to be general, varied and not applicable to this study.

The following 10 verses appear to refer, at least partially, to receiving Christ in some sort of physical manner while He was here in human form. These probably are not very applicable to our Gospel presentation:

Matthew 10:40 He that <u>receiveth</u> you <u>receiveth</u> me, and he that <u>receiveth</u> me receiveth him that sent me.

Matthew 18:5 And whoso shall <u>receive</u> one such little child in my name <u>receiveth</u> me. (δεχομα<u>ι</u>)

Mark 9:37 Whosoever shall receive one of such children in my name, receiveth me: and whosoever shall receive me, receiveth not me, but him that sent me. ($\delta\epsilon\chi\omega\mu\alpha$ 1).

Luke 9:48 And said unto them, Whosoever shall receive this child in my name <u>receiveth</u> me: and whosoever shall receive me <u>receiveth</u> him that sent me: for he that is least among you all, the same shall be great. $(\delta \epsilon \chi \omega \mu \alpha \iota)$.

Luke 9:53 And they did not <u>receive</u> him, because his face was as though he would go to Jerusalem

Lu 19:6 And he made haste, and came down, and received him joyfully.

Joh 4:45 Then when he was come into Galilee, the Galilaeans <u>received</u> him, having seen all the things that he did at Jerusalem at the feast: for they also went unto the feast.

John 5:43 I am come in my Father's name, and ye <u>receive</u> me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will <u>receive</u>.

Joh 6:21 Then they willingly <u>received</u> him into the ship: and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.

John 13:20 Verily, Verily, I say unto you, He that <u>receiveth</u> whomsoever I send <u>receiveth</u> me; and he that <u>receiveth</u> me <u>receiveth</u> him that sent me.

And the only 3 verses in 2 contexts of this category that seem to refer to receiving Jesus in the context of becoming *eternally saved*:

Joh 1:11 He came unto his own, and his own received him not

John 1:12 But as many as <u>received</u> him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: $(\lambda \alpha \mu \beta \alpha \nu \omega)$

This verse does *not* tell us *to* receive Jesus. It seems to say that the ones who believe on His name also have received Him. I suggest that "receiving" Christ is something that occurs when we believe in Him as we are commanded. This may be similar to being told that we "must be born again." This is a necessity but is not something that *we* do. It is *done* when we believe in Jesus (along with many other things such as being justified,

sealed with the Spirit, etc.) I am open to suggestions on this, but the text makes it clear that *receiving* Christ is not a command here.

Colossians 2:6 As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him:

This verse tells us to walk in Christ as we have received Him; by faith. This agrees with other Scripture. Again, please note that this verse and none of the above are imperatives.

Since we are nowhere told to "receive" Jesus and are told many times to "believe" in Him, does it not make sense to "tell it like it is." In other words, we are told many times in God's Word to believe in Jesus. Why not relay to others the accurate message that God intended.

1st Thess. 2:4 - But as we were allowed of God to be put in trust with the gospel, even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God, which trieth our hearts.

All NT Verses Containing Variations of "Accept" (27)

Varied Uses:

- Luke 4:19 To preach the <u>acceptable</u> year of the Lord.
- Luke 4:24 And he said, Verily I say unto you, No prophet is <u>accepted</u> in his own country.

- 1 Peter 2:5 Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.
- 1 Peter 2:20 For what glory *is it*, if, when ye be buffeted for your faults, ye shall take it patiently? but if, when ye do well, and suffer *for it*, ye take it patiently, this *is* acceptable with God.

Out of those listed above, none have to do with being eternally saved and none are imperatives. Out of the above 27, some are broken down into several categories.

In reference to our faithfulness or obedience:

- Romans 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, <u>acceptable</u> unto God, which is your reasonable service.
- Romans 14:18 For he that in these things serveth Christ is <u>acceptable</u> to God, and approved of men.
- 2 Corinthians 5:9 Wherefore we labour, that, whether present or absent, we may be <u>accepted</u> of him.
- Hebrews 12:28 Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God <u>acceptably</u> with reverence and godly fear:

A believer's works:

- Philippians 4:18 But I have all, and abound: I am full, having received of Epaphroditus the things *which were sent* from you, an odour of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, wellpleasing to God.
- 1 Timothy 5:4 But if any widow have children or nephews, let them learn first to shew piety at home, and to requite their parents: for that is good and acceptable before God.
- 1 Peter 2:5 Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ.
- 1 Peter 2:20 For what glory is it, if, when ye be buffeted for your faults, ye shall take it patiently? but if, when ye do well, and suffer for it, ye take it patiently, this is acceptable with God.

- Joh 16:24 Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: ask, and ye shall <u>receive</u>, that your joy may be full.
- Joh 17:8 For I have given unto them the words which thou gavest me; and they have received *them*, and have known surely that I came out from thee, and they have believed that thou didst send me.
- Joh 18:3 Judas then, having <u>received</u> a band *of men* and officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, cometh thither with lanterns and torches and weapons.
- Joh 19:30 When Jesus therefore had <u>received</u> the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost.
- Joh 20:22 And when he had said this, he breathed on *them*, and saith unto them, <u>Receive</u> ye the Holy Ghost:
- Ac 1:8 But ye shall <u>receive</u> power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.
- Ac 1:9 And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud <u>received</u> him out of their sight.
- Ac 2:33 Therefore being by the right hand of God exalted, and having <u>received</u> of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this, which ye now see and hear.
- Ac 2:38 Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall <u>receive</u> the gift of the Holy Ghost.
- Ac 2:41 Then they that gladly <u>received</u> his word were baptized: and the same day there were added *unto them* about three thousand souls.
- Ac 3:5 And he gave heed unto them, expecting to receive something of them.
- Ac 3:7 And he took him by the right hand, and lifted *him* up: and immediately his feet and ankle bones <u>received</u> strength.

- Ac 3:21 Whom the heaven must <u>receive</u> until the times of restitution of all things, which God hath spoken by the mouth of all his holy prophets since the world began.
- Ac 7:38 This is he, that was in the church in the wilderness with the angel which spake to him in the mount Sina, and *with* our fathers: who <u>received</u> the lively oracles to give unto us:
- Ac 7:53 Who have <u>received</u> the law by the disposition of angels, and have not kept it.
- Ac 7:59 And they stoned Stephen, calling upon *God*, and saying, Lord Jesus, <u>receive</u> my spirit.
- Ac 8:14 Now when the apostles which were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent unto them Peter and John:
- Ac 8:15 Who, when they were come down, prayed for them, that they might <u>receive</u> the Holy Ghost:
- Ac 8:17 Then laid they their hands on them, and they received the Holy Ghost.
- Ac 8:19 Saying, Give me also this power, that on whomsoever I lay hands, he may receive the Holy Ghost.
- Ac 9:12 And hath seen in a vision a man named Ananias coming in, and putting *his* hand on him, that he might receive his sight.
- Ac 9:17 And Ananias went his way, and entered into the house; and putting his hands on him said, Brother Saul, the Lord, *even* Jesus, that appeared unto thee in the way as thou camest, hath sent me, that thou mightest <u>receive</u> thy sight, and be filled with the Holy Ghost.
- Ac 9:18 And immediately there fell from his eyes as it had been scales: and he <u>received</u> sight forthwith, and arose, and was baptized.
- Ac 9:19 And when he had <u>received</u> meat, he was strengthened. Then was Saul certain days with the disciples which were at Damascus.
- Ac 10:16 This was done thrice: and the vessel was received up again into heaven.
- Ac 10:43 To him give all the prophets witness, that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall <u>receive</u> remission of sins.
- Ac 10:47 Can any man forbid water, that these should not be baptized, which have received the Holy Ghost as well as we?
- Ac 11:1 And the apostles and brethren that were in Judaea heard that the Gentiles had also <u>received</u> the word of God.
- Ac 15:4 And when they were come to Jerusalem, they were <u>received</u> of the church, and *of* the apostles and elders, and they declared all things that God had done with them.
- Ac 16:21 And teach customs, which are not lawful for us to <u>receive</u>, neither to observe, being Romans.
- Ac 16:24 Who, having <u>received</u> such a charge, thrust them into the inner prison, and made their feet fast in the stocks.
- Ac 17:7 Whom Jason hath <u>received</u>: and these all do contrary to the decrees of Caesar, saying that there is another king, *one* Jesus.
- Ac 17:11 These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they <u>received</u> the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so.
- Ac 17:15 And they that conducted Paul brought him unto Athens: and <u>receiving</u> a commandment unto Silas and Timotheus for to come to him with all speed, they departed.

- Ac 18:27 And when he was disposed to pass into Achaia, the brethren wrote, exhorting the disciples to <u>receive</u> him: who, when he was come, helped them much which had believed through grace:
- Ac 19:2 He said unto them, Have ye <u>received</u> the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost.
- Ac 20:24 But none of these things move me, neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might finish my course with joy, and the ministry, which I have <u>received</u> of the Lord Jesus, to testify the gospel of the grace of God.
- Ac 20:35 I have shewed you all things, how that so labouring ye ought to support the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive.
- Ac 21:17 And when we were come to Jerusalem, the brethren <u>received</u> us gladly.
- Ac 22:5 As also the high priest doth bear me witness, and all the estate of the elders: from whom also I <u>received</u> letters unto the brethren, and went to Damascus, to bring them which were there bound unto Jerusalem, for to be punished.
- Ac 22:13 Came unto me, and stood, and said unto me, Brother Saul, <u>receive</u> thy sight. And the same hour I looked up upon him.
- Ac 22:18 And saw him saying unto me, Make haste, and get thee quickly out of Jerusalem: for they will not <u>receive</u> thy testimony concerning me.
- Ac 26:10 Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison, having <u>received</u> authority from the chief priests; and when they were put to death, I gave my voice against *them*.
- Ac 26:18 To open their eyes, *and* to turn *them* from darkness to light, and *from* the power of Satan unto God, that they may <u>receive</u> forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me.
- Ac 28:2 And the barbarous people shewed us no little kindness: for they kindled a fire, and <u>received</u> us every one, because of the present rain, and because of the cold.
- Ac 28:7 In the same quarters were possessions of the chief man of the island, whose name was Publius; who <u>received</u> us, and lodged us three days courteously.
- Ac 28:21 And they said unto him, We neither <u>received</u> letters out of Judaea concerning thee, neither any of the brethren that came shewed or spake any harm of thee.
- Ac 28:30 And Paul dwelt two whole years in his own hired house, and <u>received</u> all that came in unto him,
- Ro 1:5 By whom we have <u>received</u> grace and apostleship, for obedience to the faith among all nations, for his name:
- Ro 1:27 And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and receiving in themselves that recompence of their error which was meet.
- Ro 4:11 And he <u>received</u> the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which *he had yet* being uncircumcised: that he might be the father of all them that believe, though they be not circumcised; that righteousness might be imputed unto them also:
- Ro 5:11 And not only *so*, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the atonement.

- Ro 5:17 For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.)
- Ro 8:15 For ye have not <u>received</u> the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have <u>received</u> the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father.
- Ro 11:15 For if the casting away of them *be* the reconciling of the world, what *shall* the receiving *of them be*, but life from the dead?
- Ro 13:2 Whosoever therefore resisteth the power, resisteth the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall <u>receive</u> to themselves damnation.
- Ro 14:1 Him that is weak in the faith receive ye, but not to doubtful disputations.
- Ro 14:3 Let not him that eateth despise him that eateth not; and let not him which eateth not judge him that eateth: for God hath <u>received</u> him.
- Ro 15:7 Wherefore <u>receive</u> ye one another, as Christ also <u>received</u> us to the glory of God.
- Ro 16:2 That ye <u>receive</u> her in the Lord, as becometh saints, and that ye assist her in whatsoever business she hath need of you: for she hath been a succourer of many, and of myself also.
- 1Co 2:12 Now we have <u>received</u>, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.
- 1Co 2:14 But the natural man <u>receiveth</u> not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know *them*, because they are spiritually discerned.
- 1Co 3:8 Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall <u>receive</u> his own reward according to his own labour.
- 1Co 3:14 If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall <u>receive</u> a reward.
- 1Co 4:7 For who maketh thee to differ *from another*? and what hast thou that thou didst not receive? now if thou didst receive *it*, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received *it*?
- 1Co 9:24 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one <u>receiveth</u> the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.
- 1Co 11:23 For I have <u>received</u> of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the *same* night in which he was betrayed took bread:
- 1Co 14:5 I would that ye all spake with tongues, but rather that ye prophesied: for greater *is* he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues, except he interpret, that the church may <u>receive</u> edifying.
- 1Co 15:1 Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have <u>received</u>, and wherein ye stand;
- 1Co 15:3 For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also <u>received</u>, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;
- 2Co 4:1 Therefore seeing we have this ministry, as we have <u>received</u> mercy, we faint not;
- 2Co 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things *done* in *his* body, according to that he hath done, whether *it be* good or bad.

- 2Co 6:1 We then, *as* workers together *with him*, beseech *you* also that ye <u>receive</u> not the grace of God in vain.
- 2Co 6:17 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean *thing*; and I will <u>receive</u> you,
- 2Co 7:2 <u>Receive</u> us; we have wronged no man, we have corrupted no man, we have defrauded no man.
- 2Co 7:9 Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance: for ye were made sorry after a godly manner, that ye might <u>receive</u> damage by us in nothing.
- 2Co 7:15 And his inward affection is more abundant toward you, whilst he remembereth the obedience of you all, how with fear and trembling ye received him.
- 2Co 8:4 Praying us with much intreaty that we would <u>receive</u> the gift, and *take upon us* the fellowship of the ministering to the saints.
- 2Co 11:4 For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or *if* ye <u>receive</u> another spirit, which ye have not <u>received</u>, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with *him*.
- 2Co 11:16 I say again, Let no man think me a fool; if otherwise, yet as a fool <u>receive</u> me, that I may boast myself a little.
- 2Co 11:24 Of the Jews five times <u>received</u> I forty *stripes* save one.
- Ga 1:9 As we said before, so say I now again, If any *man* preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed.
- Ga 1:12 For I neither <u>received</u> it of man, neither was I taught *it*, but by the revelation of Jesus Christ.
- Ga 3:2 This only would I learn of you, <u>Received</u> ye the Spirit by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?
- Ga 3:14 That the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.
- Ga 4:5 To redeem them that were under the law, that we might <u>receive</u> the adoption of sons.
- Ga 4:14 And my temptation which was in my flesh ye despised not, nor rejected; but received me as an angel of God, *even* as Christ Jesus.
- Eph 6:8 Knowing that whatsoever good thing any man doeth, the same shall he <u>receive</u> of the Lord, whether *he be* bond or free.
- Php 2:29 <u>Receive</u> him therefore in the Lord with all gladness; and hold such in reputation:
- Php 4:9 Those things, which ye have both learned, and <u>received</u>, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you.
- Php 4:15 Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only.
- Php 4:18 But I have all, and abound: I am full, having <u>received</u> of Epaphroditus the things *which were sent* from you, an odour of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, wellpleasing to God.
- Col 2:6 As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him:
- Col 3:24 Knowing that of the Lord ye shall <u>receive</u> the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.

- Col 3:25 But he that doeth wrong shall <u>receive</u> for the wrong which he hath done: and there is no respect of persons.
- Col 4:10 Aristarchus my fellowprisoner saluteth you, and Marcus, sister's son to Barnabas, (touching whom ye <u>received</u> commandments: if he come unto you, <u>receive</u> him;)
- Col 4:17 And say to Archippus, Take heed to the ministry which thou hast <u>received</u> in the Lord, that thou fulfil it.
- 1Th 1:6 And ye became followers of us, and of the Lord, having <u>received</u> the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Ghost:
- 1Th 2:13 For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye <u>received</u> the word of God which ye heard of us, ye <u>received</u> *it* not *as* the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.
- 1Th 4:1 Furthermore then we beseech you, brethren, and exhort *you* by the Lord Jesus, that as ye have <u>received</u> of us how ye ought to walk and to please God, *so* ye would abound more and more.
- 2Th 2:10 And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they <u>received</u> not the love of the truth, that they might be saved.
- 2Th 3:6 Now we command you, brethren, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye withdraw yourselves from every brother that walketh disorderly, and not after the tradition which he received of us.
- 1Ti 3:16 And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, <u>received</u> up into glory.
- 1Ti 4:3 Forbidding to marry, *and commanding* to abstain from meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving of them which believe and know the truth.
- 1Ti 4:4 For every creature of God *is* good, and nothing to be refused, if it be <u>received</u> with thanksgiving:
- 1Ti 5:19 Against an elder receive not an accusation, but before two or three witnesses.
- Phm 1:12 Whom I have sent again: thou therefore <u>receive</u> him, that is, mine own bowels:
- Phm 1:15 For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest <u>receive</u> him for ever;
- Phm 1:17 If thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself.
- Heb 2:2 For if the word spoken by angels was stedfast, and every transgression and disobedience <u>received</u> a just recompense of reward;
- Heb 6:7 For the earth which drinketh in the rain that cometh oft upon it, and bringeth forth herbs meet for them by whom it is dressed, receiveth blessing from God:
- Heb 7:5 And verily they that are of the sons of Levi, who <u>receive</u> the office of the priesthood, have a commandment to take tithes of the people according to the law, that is, of their brethren, though they come out of the loins of Abraham:
- Heb 7:6 But he whose descent is not counted from them <u>received</u> tithes of Abraham, and blessed him that had the promises.
- Heb 7:8 And here men that die <u>receive</u> tithes; but there he <u>receiveth</u> them, of whom it is witnessed that he liveth.
- Heb 7:9 And as I may so say, Levi also, who receiveth tithes, payed tithes in Abraham.

- Heb 7:11 If therefore perfection were by the Levitical priesthood, (for under it the people received the law,) what further need *was there* that another priest should rise after the order of Melchisedec, and not be called after the order of Aaron?
- Heb 9:15 And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions *that were* under the first testament, they which are called might <u>receive</u> the promise of eternal inheritance.
- Heb 10:26 For if we sin wilfully after that we have <u>received</u> the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins,
- Heb 10:36 For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise.
- Heb 11:8 By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after <u>receive</u> for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went.
- Heb 11:11 Through faith also Sara herself <u>received</u> strength to conceive seed, and was delivered of a child when she was past age, because she judged him faithful who had promised.
- Heb 11:13 These all died in faith, not having <u>received</u> the promises, but having seen them afar off, and were persuaded of *them*, and embraced *them*, and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth.
- Heb 11:17 By faith Abraham, when he was tried, offered up Isaac: and he that had received the promises offered up his only begotten *son*,
- Heb 11:19 Accounting that God *was* able to raise *him* up, even from the dead; from whence also he <u>received</u> him in a figure.
- Heb 11:31 By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.
- Heb 11:35 Women <u>received</u> their dead raised to life again: and others were tortured, not accepting deliverance; that they might obtain a better resurrection:
- Heb 11:39 And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, <u>received</u> not the promise:
- Heb 12:6 For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth.
- Heb 12:28 Wherefore we <u>receiving</u> a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear:
- Jas 1:7 For let not that man think that he shall <u>receive</u> any thing of the Lord.
- Jas 1:12 Blessed *is* the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.
- Jas 1:21 Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and <u>receive</u> with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls.
- Jas 2:25 Likewise also was not Rahab the harlot justified by works, when she had received the messengers, and had sent *them* out another way?
- Jas 3:1 My brethren, be not many masters, knowing that we shall <u>receive</u> the greater condemnation.
- Jas 4:3 Ye ask, and <u>receive</u> not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume *it* upon your lusts.

- Jas 5:7 Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, until he <u>receive</u> the early and latter rain.
- 1Pe 1:9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.
- 1Pe 1:18 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, *as* silver and gold, from your vain conversation <u>received</u> by tradition from your fathers;
- 1Pe 4:10 As every man hath <u>received</u> the gift, *even so* minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
- 1Pe 5:4 And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall <u>receive</u> a crown of glory that fadeth not away.
- 2Pe 1:17 For he <u>received</u> from God the Father honour and glory, when there came such a voice to him from the excellent glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.
- 2Pe 2:13 And shall <u>receive</u> the reward of unrighteousness, *as* they that count it pleasure to riot in the day time. Spots *they are* and blemishes, sporting themselves with their own deceivings while they feast with you;
- 1Jo 2:27 But the anointing which ye have <u>received</u> of him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in him.
- 1Jo 3:22 And whatsoever we ask, we <u>receive</u> of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight.
- 1Jo 5:9 If we <u>receive</u> the witness of men, the witness of God is greater: for this is the witness of God which he hath testified of his Son.
- 2Jo 1:4 I rejoiced greatly that I found of thy children walking in truth, as we have received a commandment from the Father.
- 2Jo 1:8 Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.
- 2Jo 1:10 If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, <u>receive</u> him not into *your* house, neither bid him God speed:
- 3Jo 1:8 We therefore ought to receive such, that we might be fellowhelpers to the truth.
- 3Jo 1:9 I wrote unto the church: but Diotrephes, who loveth to have the preeminence among them, <u>receiveth</u> us not.
- 3Jo 1:10 Wherefore, if I come, I will remember his deeds which he doeth, prating against us with malicious words: and not content therewith, neither doth he himself <u>receive</u> the brethren, and forbiddeth them that would, and casteth *them* out of the church.
- Re 2:17 He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the hidden manna, and will give him a white stone, and in the stone a new name written, which no man knoweth saving he that receiveth *it*.
- Re 2:27 And he shall rule them with a rod of iron; as the vessels of a potter shall they be broken to shivers: even as I <u>received</u> of my Father.
- Re 3:3 Remember therefore how thou hast <u>received</u> and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee.
- Re 4:11 Thou art worthy, O Lord, to <u>receive</u> glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.

- Re 5:12 Saying with a loud voice, Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to <u>receive</u> power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing.
- Re 13:16 And he causeth all, both small and great, rich and poor, free and bond, to receive a mark in their right hand, or in their foreheads:
- Re 14:9 And the third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand,
- Re 14:11 And the smoke of their torment ascendeth up for ever and ever: and they have no rest day nor night, who worship the beast and his image, and whosoever <u>receiveth</u> the mark of his name.
- Re 17:12 And the ten horns which thou sawest are ten kings, which have <u>received</u> no kingdom as yet; but receive power as kings one hour with the beast.
- Re 18:4 And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye <u>receive</u> not of her plagues.
- Re 19:20 And the beast was taken, and with him the false prophet that wrought miracles before him, with which he deceived them that had <u>received</u> the mark of the beast, and them that worshipped his image. These both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone.
- Re 20:4 And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and *I saw* the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received *his* mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years.

The following verses have been categorized but are also included in the comprehensive list above:

In reference to Jesus receiving us, i.e. the rapture of the church:

John 14:3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and <u>receive</u> you unto myself; that where I am, *there* ye may be also.

In reference to receiving the Holy Spirit, Not applicable to us today as we now have the Spirit. John 20:22 is the only imperative that I could find in the selected verses.

- John 20:22 And when he had said this, he breathed on *them*, and saith unto them, Receive ye the Holy Ghost:
- Acts 2:38 Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall <u>receive</u> the gift of the Holy Ghost. (also not applicable to us today).
- Acts 8:15 Who, when they were come down, prayed for them, that they might <u>receive</u> the Holy Ghost:
- Acts 8:17 Then laid they *their* hands on them, and they <u>received</u> the Holy Ghost.
- Acts 8:19 Saying, Give me also this power, that on whomsoever I lay hands, he may receive the Holy Ghost.

- Acts 10:47 Can any man forbid water, that these should not be baptized, which have received the Holy Ghost as well as we?
- Acts 19:2 He said unto them, Have ye <u>received</u> the Holy Ghost since ye believed? And they said unto him, We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost.

Receiving the word: Apparently some of these are referring to eternal life and are synonymous with believing in Jesus (e.g. Luke 8:13). The only imperative in this group is James 1:21, which is speaking to those who already saved:

- Matthew 13:20 But he that <u>received</u> the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy <u>receiveth</u> it; (The first "received" has to do with sowing seed. The second "receiveth is "λαμβανω."
- Mark 4:16 And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; λαμβανω
- Mark 4:20 And these are they which are sown on good ground; such as hear the word, and receive it, and bring forth fruit, some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some an hundred. $\pi\alpha\rho\alpha\delta\epsilon\chi\omega\mu\alpha\iota$
- Luke 8:13 They on the rock *are they*, which, when they hear, <u>receive</u> the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away. δεχομαι
- Acts 2:41 Then they that gladly <u>received</u> his word were baptized: and the same day there were added *unto them* about three thousand souls.
- Acts 8:14 Now when the apostles which were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent unto them Peter and John:
- Acts 11:1 And the apostles and brethren that were in Judaea heard that the Gentiles had also <u>received</u> the word of God.
- Acts 17:11 These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they <u>received</u> the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so.
- 1 Thessalonians 1:6 And ye became followers of us, and of the Lord, having <u>received</u> the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Ghost:
- 1 Thessalonians 2:13 For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye <u>received</u> the word of God which ye heard of us, ye <u>received</u> *it* not *as* the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.
- James 1:21 Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and <u>receive</u> with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

In reference to receiving remission (forgiveness; not justification) of sins:

Acts 10:43 To him give all the prophets witness, that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall <u>receive</u> remission of sins.

Acts 26:18 To open their eyes, *and* to turn *them* from darkness to light, and *from* the power of Satan unto God, that they may <u>receive</u> forgiveness of sins, and inheritance among them which are sanctified by faith that is in me.

In reference to receiving the knowledge of the truth:

Hebrews 10:26 For if we sin wilfully after that we have <u>received</u> the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins,

In reference to receiving the atonement:

Romans 5:11 And not only *so*, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the atonement.

In reference to "receiving" the Kingdom of God:

- Mark 10:15 Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not <u>receive</u> the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein. δεχομαι
- Luke 18:17 Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not <u>receive</u> the kingdom of God as a little child shall in no wise enter therein. δεχομαι

The faithful will "receive" rewards:

- Matthew 19:29 And every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall <u>receive</u> an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life.
- 1 Corinthians 3:8 Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour.
- 1 Corinthians 3:14 If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward.
- 1 Corinthians 9:24 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one <u>receiveth</u> the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.
- 2 Corinthians 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may <u>receive</u> the things *done* in *his* body, according to that he hath done, whether *it be* good or bad.
- Colossians 3:24 Knowing that of the Lord ye shall <u>receive</u> the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.
- Hebrews 9:15 And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions *that were* under the first testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance.
- James 1:12 Blessed *is* the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.
- 1 Peter 5:4 And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall <u>receive</u> a crown of glory that fadeth not away.
- 2 John 1:8 Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.
